SEAWORLD SAN ANTONIO OPENS 2014 SEASON
SATURDAY, FEB. 1, WITH WILDLIFE EXPERT/TV STAR JACK HANNA

SAN ANTONIO, TX (Jan. 13, 2014) – SeaWorld San Antonio kicks off its 2014 season Saturday, Feb. 1, with appearances by internationally known wildlife expert and TV star Jack Hanna to mark the debut of “Wild Days,” special animal shows every weekend in February.

SeaWorld San Antonio will feature Hanna, host of the popular “Jack Hanna’s Into the Wild” TV show, on Saturday, Feb. 1, and Sunday, Feb. 2. Hanna will introduce guests to amazing animals from around the world.

“Wild Days” continues with three more weekends of fascinating animal presentations:

- Saturday, Feb. 8, and Sunday, Feb. 9: **“Wild Days: Amazing Animals”** – A professor and his students go on a quest to learn about wallabies, alligators, porcupines, snakes and more in this stage show with live animals.
- Saturday, Feb. 15, Sunday, Feb. 16, and Monday, Feb. 17: **“Wild Days: Flying High”** – This live show introduces guests to some feathered friends from “Last Chance Forever,” an organization dedicated to the rehabilitation and release of sick, injured and orphaned birds of prey into their natural habitats.
- Saturday, Feb. 22, and Sunday, Feb. 23: **“Wild Days: SeaWorld Live! with Chuck Cureau”** – SeaWorld’s own animal expert and TV personality Chuck Cureau hosts a show with intriguing animals including a California sea lion, penguins and many others, and their amazing stories of rescue, rehabilitation and preservation, along with special guests, Julie Scardina and Pedro Ramos-Navarrete, animal ambassadors for the SeaWorld and Busch Gardens parks.

The 2014 season will continue to accelerate in March when all three SeaWorld parks from coast to coast launch SeaWorld's 50th Celebration, an 18-month observance that highlights memorable SeaWorld experiences over the past half-century. EZ Pay monthly payment options are also available on the park's Annual Passes for those who qualify. Single-day admission to SeaWorld is \$65 plus tax for adults and \$55 plus tax for children ages 3 to 9.
